

NEW ECONOMICS FOR A NEW ERA

FOUR DECADES OF CHALLENGING ORTHODOXIES



IN 1984, PRIME MINISTER MARGARET THATCHER **HOSTED THE LEADERS** OF THE G7 CLUB OF RICH **COUNTRIES AT LANCASTER** HOUSE, IN LONDON, FOR THEIR ANNUAL SUMMIT. A FEW HUNDRED METRES DOWN THE ROAD, A **DIVERSE GROUP OF ENVIRONMENTALISTS.** RADICAL ECONOMISTS AND **COMMUNITY ACTIVISTS WERE** ALSO MEETING FOR WHAT THEY CALLED THE OTHER ECONOMIC SUMMIT.

This eclectic group wanted to challenge the neoliberal doctrine driving the economic policies of Thatcher and US president Ronald Reagan. These visionaries could see the damage such policies were already causing and wanted to create a new economics that would help people rather than harm them.

In their words, they wanted to find

"new ways of organising work and meeting human needs; a new emphasis on economic self-reliance... new awareness of ecological constraints... and new economic concepts to take these into account; and new growth areas for economic activity in energy-efficient and resource-conserving industries."

The concerns raised in 1984 seem eerily prescient. Over the last 40 years, both people and planet have paid the price for an extractive and exploitative model of capitalism that was let loose those years ago.



1. POWER

People and communities are being systematically stripped of their power, denied a meaningful say in how society and the economy work. No wonder people are feeling disillusioned or turning to populists and extremists.

2. INEQUALITY

We are witnessing eye-watering, unprecedented levels of inequality between people and countries, fraying the social fabric that is essential if we are to tackle collective challenges. Deep injustices of gender, race and other dimensions of oppression have not just been neglected but have often been reinforced by a system designed to benefit a few.

3. ENVIRONMENT

Nature has been exploited for private gain, with all of us paying the price for ecological breakdown. Worse still, the resulting climate crisis is wreaking havoc on the poorest and most marginalised communities.

OVER THE LAST 40 YEARS, THE NEW ECONOMICS FOUNDATION (NEF) HAS WORKED HARD TO PRODUCE RADICAL IDEAS, INFLUENCE POLICYMAKING AND ORGANISE COMMUNITIES TO DELIVER A MORE JUST AND SUSTAINABLE WORLD.

From global debt justice to retrofitting homes, from the Happy Planet Index to campaigning for a 4-day working week and from promoting local economic development to championing the Green New Deal, NEF has been arguing for an economics that recognises people and planet matter.

Today, we need to redouble of our efforts to go beyond the dogma of austerity, invest in a set of institutions fit for the 21st century, reimagine the way that power works in our society and provide the solutions for a brighter future.

As one of Britain's leading progressive think tanks, with a European presence and international reach, we take our responsibility to help deliver a radically better world seriously. We see our role as pushing governments to dream bigger, to show evidence of why and how we can do better, and lay the ground for truly bold ideas and approaches.

We believe another world is possible and we recognise that our true power and potential lies in working in a respectful and collaborative way with others, whether it is others in the new economy movement or the communities we engage with. Transformational change will only come if we work together effectively. We will play our part as a creator of ideas, an expert influencer and a hub of innovation/incubation, while also recognising the importance of working as a movement.

AN ENVIRONMENT TO THRIVE IN

We are at the cusp of several tipping points in nature and climate, which will have devastating consequences for our economy and society at large. But, with decisive and deep action, we can avoid the worst impacts of climate breakdown and build more equal and happier societies. How we invest and transform our economics in the next few years will have profound impacts over decades. We need to deliver adequate investments in critical areas of the green transition, ensuring fast and equitable action for a sustainable future.

A POLITICS FOR ALL

Levels of trust and confidence in government are at record lows, with many of us feeling disillusioned and society riven by divisive politics, including the so-called "greenlash" against the transition to net zero. However, when people co-operate, they have the power to make change happen. We need to help bring communities together, amplify their voices and strengthen their power to show that we can reimagine how our democracies work.

A STATE FIT FOR THE 21ST CENTURY

After years of neglect and underinvestment, the state needs to be modernised and empowered so that it can rein in the extremes of market forces, discipline capital and manage significant technological shifts. We need to design and deliver public services – from adequate social housing to a healthy NHS – that are resilient and fit for 21st century purpose. We will also need to find effective ways of paying for green investment, decent public services, and devolved decision-making.



A NEW INTERNATIONALISM

We live in an increasingly interconnected world, and we will not be able to deliver on our ambitions in the UK without effective international cooperation on key areas of progressive economic policymaking. We need a global financial architecture that provides adequate global public finance, more effective interventions to provide social protection to those being left behind by the global economy, and better ways of holding power-holders to account for delivering on their commitments.

THRIVING LOCAL COMMUNITIES

There is an unmet thirst to deliver more meaningful devolution, particularly in England. We have an opportunity to show how devolving power can be transformative to our democracy and economy. From fixing local government funding issues and investing in people and their communities to ensure places are not stripped of their wealth, to engaging people in real decision-making, we can demonstrate how giving economic and political power to local and regional areas can create thriving local economies and invigorate people's participation in democracy.



BUILD A FAST AND FAIR TRANSITION TO A GREEN ECONOMY



We all want to live on a healthy planet, but our economy is currently designed around making profits from fossil fuels that accelerate climate breakdown.

We can re-design our economy with progressive fiscal and monetary policies, green industrial initiatives and the creation of green jobs to tackle the climate and inequality crises at the same time.

GUARANTEE ECONOMIC SECURITY FOR ALL



Following decades of underinvestment, our public services are crumbling and too many of us cannot afford life's essentials. When we have access to affordable housing, good quality childcare and decent quality jobs we are able to thrive.
